April 7

- FC 35 Did Adam act for himself alone in the covenant of life? No he represented the whole human race.
- FC 36 What did Adam's sin do to you? It made me guilty and sinful.

WSC 26 – How does Christ execute the office of a king? Christ executes the office of a king, in subduing us to himself, in ruling and defending us, and in restraining and conquering all his and our enemies.

April 14

- FC 37 How sinful are you by nature? I am corrupt in every part of my being.
- WSC 27 Wherein did Christ's humiliation consist? Christ's humiliation consisted in his being born, and that in a low condition, made under the law, undergoing the miseries of this life, the wrath of God, and the cursed death of the cross; in being buried, and continuing under the power of death for a time.

- FC 38 Can you go to heaven with this sinful nature? No my heart must be changed before I can be fit for
- FC 39 What is the changing of your heart called? The new birth, or regeneration.
- FC 40 Who is able to change your heart? The Holy Spirit alone.
- WSC 28 Wherein consists Christ's exaltation? Christ's exaltation consists in his rising again from the dead on the third day, in ascending up into heaven, in sitting at the right hand of God the Father, and in coming to judge the world at the last day.

May 5

- FC 41 Can you be saved through the covenant of life? No because I broke it and am condemned by it.
- FC 42 How did you break the covenant of life? Adam represented me, and so I fell with him in his first sin.
- WSC 29 How are we made partakers of the redemption purchased by Christ? We are made partakers of the redemption purchased by Christ, by the effectual application of it to us by his Holy Spirit.
- WSC 30 How does the Spirit apply to us the redemption purchased by Christ? The Spirit applies to us the redemption purchased by Christ, by working faith in us, and thereby uniting us to Christ in our effectual calling.

May 12 – Mother's Day

Ephesians 6:1-3 – Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. ² "Honor your father and mother," which is the first commandment with promise: 3 "that it may be well with you and you may live long on the earth."

May 19

- FC 43 How, then, can you be saved? By the Lord Jesus Christ in the covenant of grace.
- FC 44 Who was represented by Jesus in the covenant of grace? His elect people.
- FC $45 How \ did \ Jesus \ fulfill \ the \ covenant \ of \ grace?$ He kept the whole law for his people, and then was punished for all their sins.
- WSC 31 What is effectual calling? Effectual calling is the work of God's Spirit, whereby, convincing us of our sin and misery, enlightening our minds in the knowledge of Christ, and renewing our wills, he does persuade and enable us to embrace Jesus Christ, freely offered to us in the gospel.
- WSC 32 What benefits do they that are effectually called partake of in this life? They that are effectually called do in this life partake of justification, adoption, and sanctification, and the several benefits which in this life do either accompany or flow from them.

May 26

- FC 46 Did Jesus ever sin? No he lived a sinless life.
- FC 47 How could the Son of God suffer? The Son of God became a man so that he could obey and suffer.
- FC 48 For whom did Christ obey and suffer? For all who were given to him by the Father.
- WSC 33 What is justification? Justification is an act of God's free grace, wherein he pardons all our sins, and accepts us as righteous in His sight, only for the righteousness of Christ imputed to us, and received by faith alone.

June 2

- FC 49 What kind of life did Christ live on earth? A life of poverty and suffering.
- FC 50 What kind of death did Jesus die? The painful and shameful death of the cross.
- WSC 34 What is adoption? Adoption is an act of God's free grace, whereby we are received into the number, and have a right to all the privileges, of the sons of God.

June 9

- FC 51 What is meant by the atonement? Christ satisfied God's justice by his suffering and death in the place of sinners.
- WSC 35 What is sanctification? Sanctification is the work of God's free grace, whereby we are renewed in the whole man after the image of God, and are enabled more and more to die unto sin, and live unto righteousness.

June 16 – Fathers' Day

<u>Psalm 68:4-6</u> – Sing to God, sing praises to His name; extol Him who rides on the clouds, by His name Yah, and rejoice before Him. <u>A father of the fatherless</u>, a defender of widows, *is* God in His holy habitation. God sets the solitary in families; He brings out those who are bound into prosperity; but the rebellious dwell in a dry *land*.

- FC 52 What did God the Father guarantee in the covenant of grace? To justify and sanctify all those for whom Christ died.
- FC 53 How can God justify you? By forgiving all my sins and declaring me righteous.
- FC 54 How can God sanctify you? By making me holy in heart and conduct.
- WSC 36 What are the benefits which in this life do accompany or flow from justification, adoption, and sanctification? The benefits which in this life do accompany or flow from justification, adoption, and sanctification, are, assurance of God's love, peace of conscience, joy in the Holy Ghost, increase of grace,

and perseverance therein to the end.

June 30

- FC 55 What must you do to be saved? I must repent of my sins, believe in Christ and live a new life.
- FC 56 How do you repent of your sins? By being sorry enough for my sin to hate it and forsake it.
- FC 57 Why must you hate and forsake your sin? Because it displeases God.
- FC 58 What does it mean to believe in Christ? To trust in him alone for my salvation.
- WSC 37 What benefits do believers receive from Christ at death? The souls of believers are at their death made perfect in holiness, and do immediately pass into glory; and their bodies, being still united in Christ, do rest in their graves, till the resurrection.
