July 1

FC 101 – *What is the tenth commandment?* “You shall not covet your neighbor’s house. You shall not covet your neighbor’s wife, or his manservant or maidservant, his ox or donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbor.”

FC 102 – *What does the tenth commandment teach you?* To be content with whatever God chooses to give me.

WSC 88 – *What are the outward and ordinary means whereby Christ communicates to us the benefits of redemption?* The outward and ordinary means whereby Christ communicates to us the benefits of redemption are, his ordinances, especially the Word, sacraments, and prayer; all which are made effectual to the elect for salvation.

WSC 89 – *How is the Word made effectual to salvation?* The Spirit of God makes the reading, but especially the preaching, of the Word, an effectual means of convincing and converting sinners, and of building them up in holiness and comfort, through faith, unto salvation.

WSC 90 – *How is the Word to be read and heard, that it may become effectual to salvation?* That the Word may become effectual to salvation, we must attend thereunto with diligence, preparation, and prayer; receive it with faith and love, lay it up in our hearts, and practice it in our lives.

July 8

FC 103 – *Can you keep the Ten Commandments perfectly?* No – since the fall of Adam, the only one who has been able to do this is Jesus.

FC 104 – *Of what use are the Ten Commandments to you?* They teach me what is pleasing to God, and how much I need a savior.

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July 15

FC 105 – *What is prayer?* Prayer is asking God for the things he has promised in the Bible – and giving thanks for what he has given.

WSC 91 – *How do the sacraments become effectual means of salvation?* The sacraments become effectual

means of salvation, not from any virtue in them, or in him that does administer them; but only by the blessing of Christ, and the working of his Spirit in them that by faith receive them.

WSC 92 – *What is a sacrament?* A sacrament is a holy ordinance instituted by Christ; wherein, by sensible signs, Christ, and the benefits of the new covenant, are represented, sealed, and applied to believers.

WSC 93 – *Which are the sacraments of the New Testament?* The sacraments of the New Testament are, baptism, and the Lord's Supper.

July 22

FC 106 – *In whose name are we to pray?* In the name of Christ only.

FC 107 – *What did Christ give us to teach us about prayer?* The Lord's Prayer.

FC 108 – *What is the Lord's Prayer?* "Our father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one. For yours is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen."

WSC 94 – *What is baptism?* Baptism is a sacrament, wherein the washing with water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost, does signify and seal our ingrafting into Christ, and partaking of the benefits of the covenant of grace, and our engagement to be the Lord's.

WSC 95 – *To whom is Baptism to be administered?* Baptism is not to be administered to any that are out of the visible church, till they profess their faith in Christ, and obedience to him; but the infants of such as are members of the visible church are to be baptized.

July 29

FC 109 – *How many things do we pray for in the Lord's Prayer?* Six.

FC 110 – *What do we pray first?* "Hallowed be your name."

FC 111 – *What does it mean to pray, "Hallowed be your name"?* We are asking God to enable us and all creation to honor his name.

WSC 96 – *What is the Lord's Supper?* The Lord's Supper is a sacrament, wherein, by giving and receiving bread and wine, according to Christ's appointment, his death is showed forth; and the worthy receivers are, not after a corporal and carnal manner, but by faith, made partakers of his body and blood, with all his benefits, to their spiritual nourishment, and growth in grace.

WSC 97 – *What is required for the worthy receiving of the Lord's Supper?* It is required of them that would worthily partake of the Lord's Supper, that they examine themselves of their knowledge to discern the Lord's body, of their faith to feed upon him, of their repentance, love, and new obedience; lest, coming unworthily, they eat and drink judgment to themselves.

August 5

FC 112 – *What do we pray second?* "Your kingdom come."

FC 113 – *What does it mean to pray, "Your kingdom come"?* We are asking God to bring more and more people to believe and obey his gospel.

WSC 98 – *What is prayer?* Prayer is an offering up of our desires unto God, for things agreeable to his will, in the name of Christ, with confession of our sins, and thankful acknowledgment of his mercies.

August 12

FC 114 – *What do we pray third?* "Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven."

FC 115 – *What does it mean to pray, "Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven"?* We are asking God

to make us able and willing to serve him as the angels do in heaven.

WSC 99 – *What rule has God given for our direction in prayer?* The whole Word of God is of use to direct us in prayer; but the special rule of direction is that form of prayer which Christ taught his disciples, commonly called the Lord's Prayer.

WSC 100 – *What does the preface of the Lord's Prayer teach us?* *The preface of the Lord's Prayer, which is, Our Father in heaven, teaches us to draw near to God with all holy reverence and confidence, as children to a father, able and ready to help us; and that we should pray with and for others.*

August 19

FC 116 – *What do we pray fourth?* “Give us today our daily bread.”

FC 117 – *What does it mean to pray, “Give us this day our daily bread”?* We are asking God to provide us with all that we really need.

WSC 101 – *What do we pray for in the first petition?* In the first petition, which is, Hallowed be Your name, we pray that God would enable us, and others, to glorify him in all that whereby he makes himself known; and that he would dispose all things to his own glory.

September 9

FC 118 – *What do we pray fifth?* “Forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors.”

FC 119 – *What does it mean to pray, “Forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors”?* We are asking God to forgive our sins for Christ's sake, and to make us willing to forgive others.

WSC 102 – *What do we pray for in the second petition?* In the second petition, which is, Your kingdom come, we pray that Satan's kingdom may be destroyed; and that the kingdom of grace may be advanced, ourselves and others brought into it, and kept in it; and that the kingdom of glory may be hastened.

September 16

FC 120 – *What do we pray sixth?* “And lead us not in to temptation, but deliver us from the evil one.”

FC 121 – *What does it mean to pray, “And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one?”* We are asking God to keep us from being tempted, or to make us strong enough to resist if we are tempted.

WSC 103 – *What do we pray for in the third petition?* In the third petition, which is, *Your will be done in earth, as it is in heaven*, we pray that God, by his grace, would make us able and willing to know, obey, and submit to his will in all things, as the angels do in heaven.

September 23

FC 122 – *How many sacraments are there?* Two.

FC 123 – *What are they called?* Baptism and the Lord's Supper.

FC 124 – *Who appointed these sacraments?* The Lord Jesus Christ.

FC 125 – *Why did Christ appoint these sacraments?* To mark us off from the world, and to give us comfort and strength.

WSC 104 – *What do we pray for in the fourth petition?* In the fourth petition, which is, Give us this day our daily bread, we pray that of God's free gift we may receive a competent portion of the good things of this life, and enjoy his blessing with them.
