FCQ. 47 – How could the Son of God suffer? The Son of God became a man so that he could obey and suffer.

FCQ. 48 – For whom did Christ obey and suffer? For all who were given to him by the Father.

FCQ. 49 – What kind of life did Christ live on earth? A life of poverty and suffering.

FCQ. 50 – What kind of death did Jesus die? The painful and shameful death of the cross.

SCQ. 34 – *What is adoption?* Adoption is an act of God's free grace, whereby we are received into the number, and have a right to all the privileges, of the sons of God.

FCQ. 51 - What is meant by the atonement? Christ satisfied God's justice by his suffering and death in the place of sinners.

SCQ. 35 – What is sanctification? Sanctification is the work of God's free grace, whereby we are renewed in the whole man after the image of God, and are enabled more and more to die unto sin, and live unto righteousness.

FCQ. 52 – What did God the Father guarantee in the covenant of grace? To justify and sanctify all those for whom Christ died.

SCQ. 36 – What are the benefits which in this life do accompany or flow from justification, adoption, and sanctification? The benefits which in this life do accompany or flow from justification, adoption, and sanctification, are, assurance of God's love, peace of conscience, joy in the Holy Ghost, increase of grace, and perseverance therein to the end.

SCQ. 37 – What benefits do believers receive from Christ at death? The souls of believers are at their death made perfect in holiness, and do immediately pass into glory; and their bodies, being still united in Christ, do rest in their graves, till the resurrection.

FCQ. 54 – How can God sanctify you? By making me holy in heart and conduct.
